## I. Key Message

Social studies provides opportunities for students to develop the attitudes, skills and knowledge that will enable them to become engaged, active, informed and responsible citizens. Recognition and respect for individual and collective identity is essential in a pluralistic and democratic society. Social studies helps students develop their sense of self and community, encouraging them to affirm their place as citizens in an inclusive, democratic society.

#### **II. Course Overview**

Welcome to the Grade 8 Social Studies program. This program has been designed to allow you to learn and explore the historical concept of Worldviews. The focus of grade 8 social studies is to examine the issues related to contact between societies with different worldviews.

You will examine how these world views were expressed in different times and in different places and learn how intercultural contact between societies leads to change and alteres each society's worldview.

## III. Scope and Sequence

This course will be divided into **Three** units:

**Unit 1:** The Birth and Spread of the Western Worldview (Renaissance Europe)

**Unit 2:**Worldviews in Conflict (The Aztecs and the Spanish)

**Unit 3:** From Isolation to Adaptation: Japan
